

The Mozarteum Foundation Salzburg, established in 1842 by the citizens of Salzburg, is dedicated to preserving and celebrating the legacy of **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart**.

The Foundation's musical program caters to both locals and tourists, offering many concerts that showcase Salzburg's finest musicians alongside internationally renowned guest artists.

Conveniently located near Salzburg's city center, the highlight of the Mozarteum Foundation Salzburg's annual program is the "**Mozart Week**", held around January 27th, Mozart's birthday. This festival features about 30 orchestral, chamber, and soloist concerts performed by the world's foremost Mozart interpreters.

Acclaimed as the leading Mozart festival on the international stage, it is an event that promises an extraordinary celebration of the composer's work!





### **Marble Hall at Mirabell Palace**

The Marble Hall at **Mirabell Palace** offers a unique musical experience, embodying the beauty and history of Salzburg. Once you have visited the Marble Hall and the baroque gardens, you will surely agree with this name choice! The baroque Marble Hall of Mirabell Palace is considered one of the most beautiful and historically significant concert halls in Salzburg.

Besides the usual concerts featuring the works of Mozart, Tchaikovsky, and others, Mirabell Palace offers a **Dinner & Concert** experience. Starting at 6 p.m., you can enjoy a three-course meal in the renowned Sheraton style. Afterwards, a classical concert begins at 8 p.m.



# Haus für Mozart (House for Mozart)

Haus für Mozart in Salzburg is a unique place that will surprise you with its beauty once you step inside. Originally known as the "Kleines Festspielhaus," this concert hall opened its doors in 1925 and has since become part of Salzburg's rich cultural heritage.

The venue is particularly renowned for its performances of Mozart and Rossini operas, as well as Baroque stageworks. The transformation of the former court stables into this magnificent hall was undertaken by architects Wilhelm Holzbauer and François Valentiny, in honor of the Mozart Year 2006 celebrations.

#### **Felsenreitschule**

Located by the Mönchsberg mountain, this venue is truly amazing with its stunning stage and iconic stone arcades. As one of Salzburg's most significant and largest concert halls, it accommodates 1,437 spectators!

In its earlier years, audiences watched performances from the 96 arcades spread across three levels. However, a significant renovation at the end of the 1960s, led by Clemens Holzmeister, saw the addition of a lower stage, an orchestra pit, and a weatherproof retractable roof.

Today, the Felsenreitschule continues to impress visitors with its rich history and exceptional performances.

#### Carabinieri Hall at Residenz Palace

The Carabinieri Hall at the Residenz Palace in Salzburg is a venue known for its impressive architecture. This magnificent hall, measuring 50 meters long, 12 meters wide, and equally high, stands as the largest room within the Residenz.

The Carabinieri Hall has hosted grand celebrations, balls, and theatrical performances, with Monteverdi's L'Orfeo staged here in 1614, marking the first opera performance north of the Alps.

Visitors to the Carabinieri Hall can enjoy classical music concerts, featuring the works of renowned composers like Mozart, Beethoven, and Strauss. These performances, set in the elegant ambiance of the hall, transport audiences back to the golden age of Salzburg.

#### St. Peter Stiftskeller

St. Peter Stiftskeller is a historic treasure with a legacy that stretches back to the year 803 AD. It is considered as one of the oldest restaurant in the world and was once graced by the presence of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart himself.

Here, you can be transported back to the 18th century with the Mozart Dinner Concert, an experience that combines culinary delights with the timeless music of Mozart.

The evening unfolds in the Baroque Hall, where the mood is set by two opera singers and five instrumentalists from the Amadeus Consort adorned in period costumes. The historical menu, meticulously crafted to reflect the tastes of Mozart's era, complements the musical program, creating an evening that you won't forget!

#### **Hohensalzburg Fortress**

Begin your evening with a delightful dinner, setting the stage for the night's main attraction: a Fortress Concert held in either the Golden Hall or the Burgsaal. Here, you will get to watch and listen to internationally renowned musicians from the Mozart Chamber Orchestra of Salzburg or the Salzburg Mozart Ensemble.

For those opting for the VIP Dinner & Fortress Concert, the experience is elevated further when the weather permits dining on the scenic terrace of the fortress restaurant.

#### St. Blasius Church

St. Blasius Church, at the end of Salzburg's Getreidegasse and directly on the cliff of the Mönchsberg, is a historic venue with roots tracing back to the 12th century.

Within its Gothic Hall, the church provides a breathtaking setting for a variety of concerts, including the renowned Salzburg Advent Serenades. These events showcase the talents of both local and international musicians.

While the architecture and history alone are worth the visit, attending a musical performance here transforms the experience into something truly magical, as the music reverberates through the centuries-old structure, creating an unforgettable experience!

#### Grosse Universitätsaula

The Grosse Universitätsaula, also known as the Great Hall, stands as one of the most esteemed venues at Salzburg University. This room has hosted numerous renowned Salzburg composers, including Leopold Mozart and his prodigious son, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

A historic milestone was reached here on May 13, 1767, when young Wolfgang's opera "Apollo et Hyacinthus," had its premiere performance.

In celebration of Mozart Year and following extensive renovations, the Great Hall reopened in January 2005 as a modern venue for concerts and special events. Today, the revitalized Great Hall is among Salzburg's most famous concert locations.
